REQUIRED COURSES FOR UNDERGRADUATE MAJORS

By state law, all students enrolled in an undergraduate education major must complete the following courses, either before or during their participation in this program:

EDF 1005 Introduction to Education
EDG 2701 Teaching Diverse Populations
EME 2040 Introduction to Educational Technology

In addition, the Program in Visual Impairment requires that all students take a course in development. This requirement can be met by taking CHD 2220, EEX 4201, or EDF 4210.
